Share the QR Code and Contact Info with Those in Need

The New Jersey Department of Children & Families has developed the following [QR code](#) for providers and those serving the youth to share with children and families at risk or currently experiencing child abuse.

Using any mobile device's camera function, one can 'capture' a web address using the QR code that leads to [a poster designed specifically for children](#), with a list of hotlines and helplines. The QR code is discreet, which allows children to access the information or resources they need to be safe.

Be sure to use this QR code in your online/telehealth/digital youth interactions who appear to be at risk. It can be shared during a virtual visit, texted, e-mailed, or any other digital communication. Together we can help to keep New Jersey's children safe, healthy and connected.
